Lessons From Leading Cleavland Clinic's Integrated Care and Digital Strategy Across USA, Abu Dhabi and London Cleavland Clinic consistently ranks amongst the world's top 3-5 hospital networks. The network is particularly famous for pioneering medical breakthroughs such as the coronary artery bypass surgery and the first face transplant in the United States. Moreover, it has gained a reputation for its ambitious adoption of digital innovation and strategy to re-define healthcare.

Gareth recently led the technology strategy for the expansion of Cleavland Clinic's renowned care strategy from the USA into London and Abu Dhabi through new digital hospitals. He still continues to be associated with the delivery of these projects and will talk us through:


